If you are interested in reviewing manuscripts for APA journals, the APA Publications and Communications Board would like to invite your participation. Manuscript reviewers are vital to the publication process. As a reviewer, you would gain valuable experience in publishing. The P&C Board is particularly interested in encouraging women and ethnic minority men and women to participate more in this process. Please note the following important points:

- (1) To be selected as a reviewer, you must have published articles in peer-reviewed journals. The experience of publication provides a reviewer with the basis for preparing a thorough, objective evaluative review.
- (2) To select the appropriate reviewers for each manuscript, the editor needs detailed information. Please include with your letter your vita. In your letter, please identify in which APA journal you are interested and describe your area of expertise. Be as specific as possible. For example, "social psychology" is not sufficient—you would need to specify "social cognition" or "attitude change" as well.
- (3) Reviewing a manuscript takes time. If you are selected to review a manuscript, be prepared to invest the necessary time to evaluate the manuscript thoroughly.
