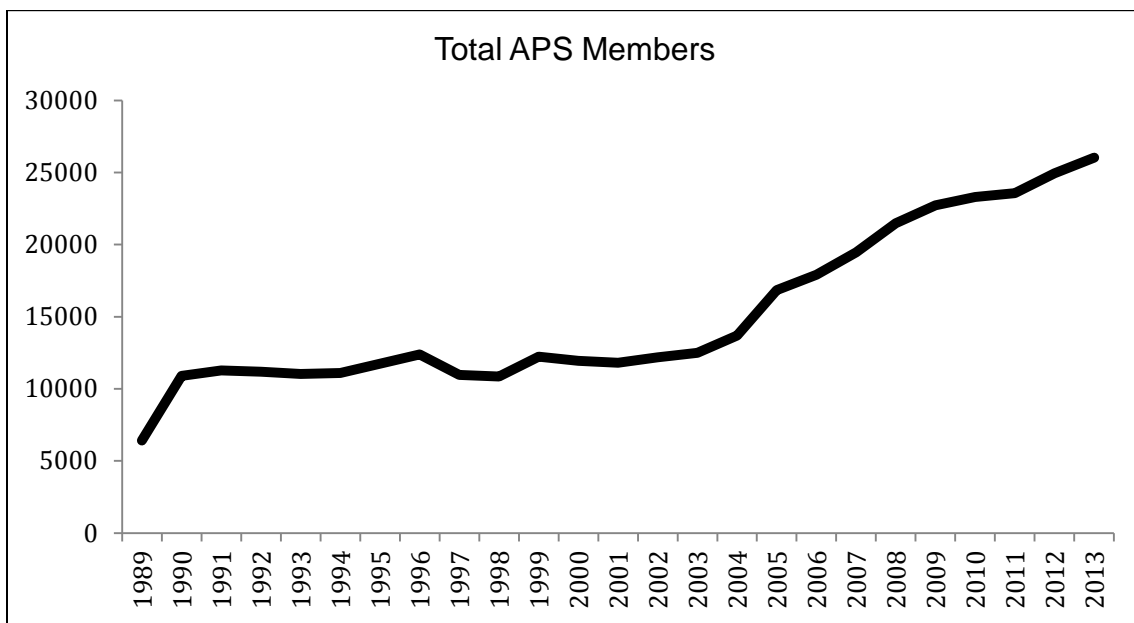

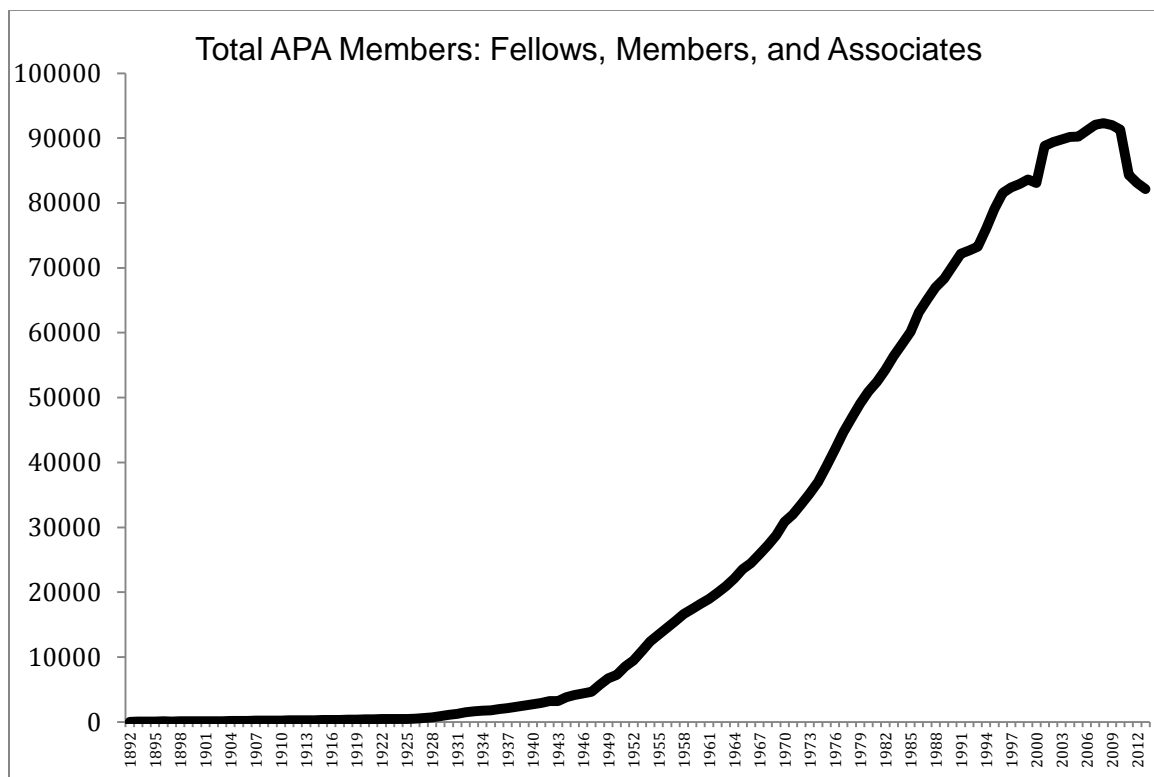

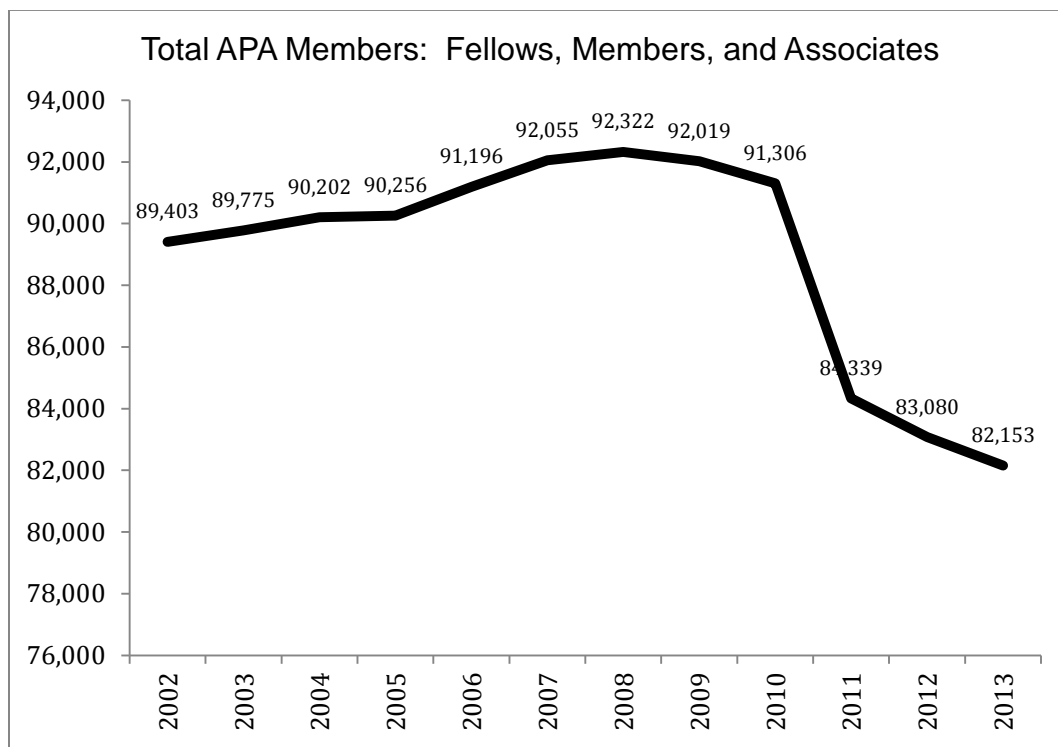
APA Membership 1892-2013.

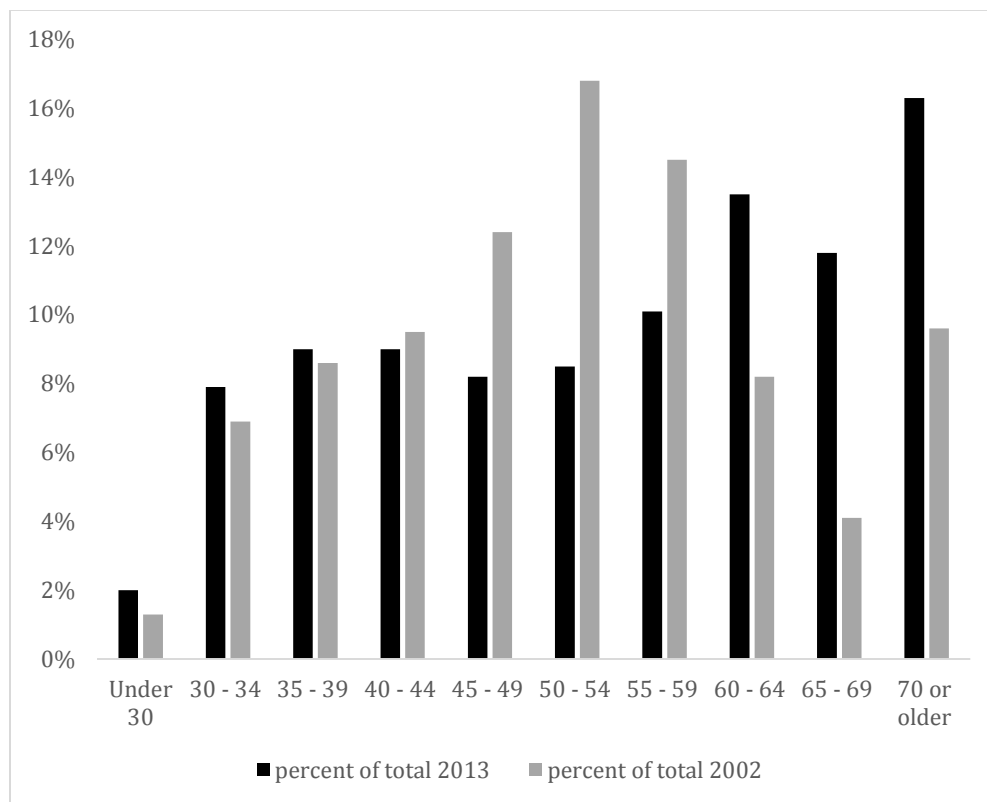
APA Membership 2002-2013.

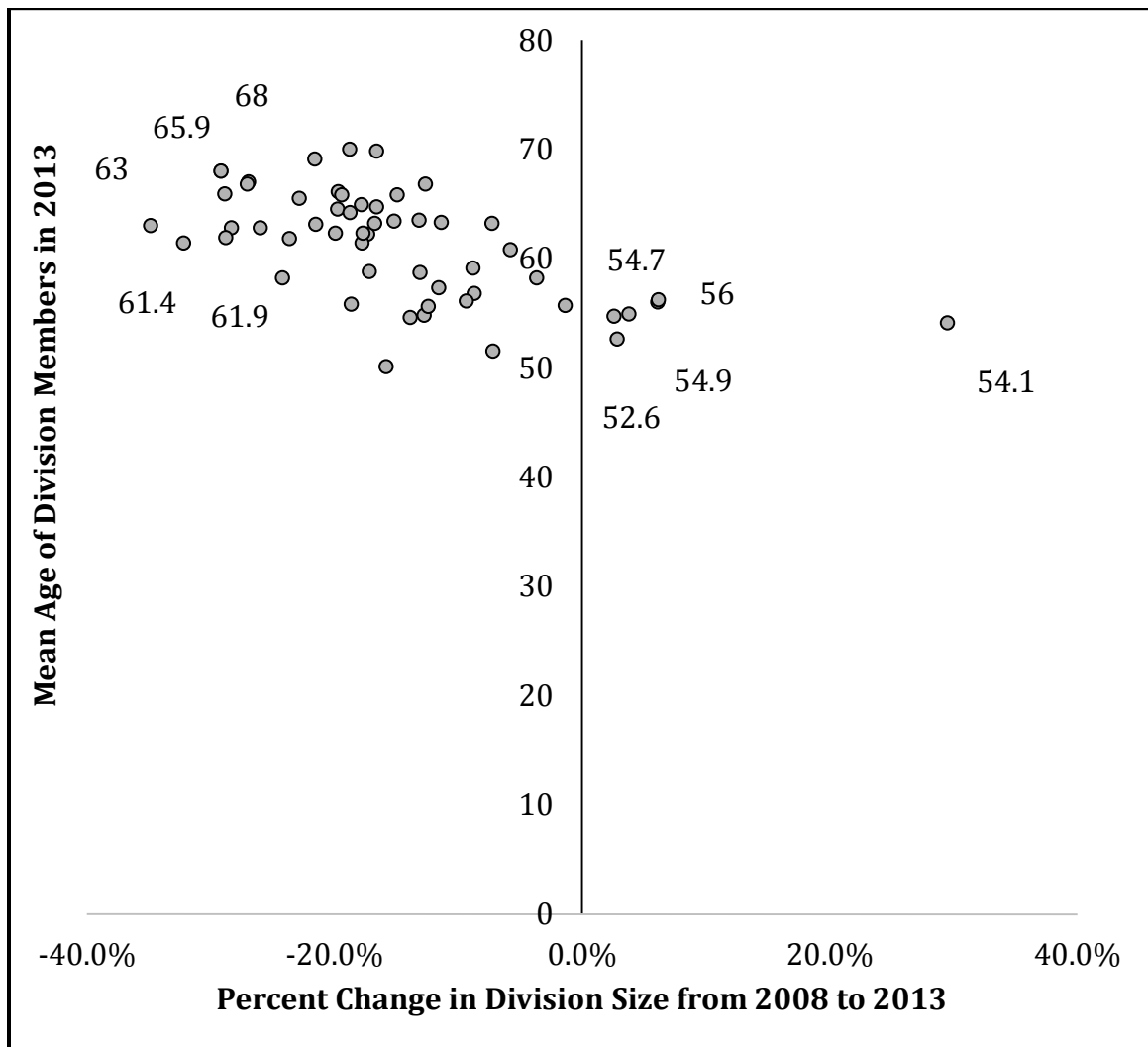
Age of APA Members in 2002 and 2013.

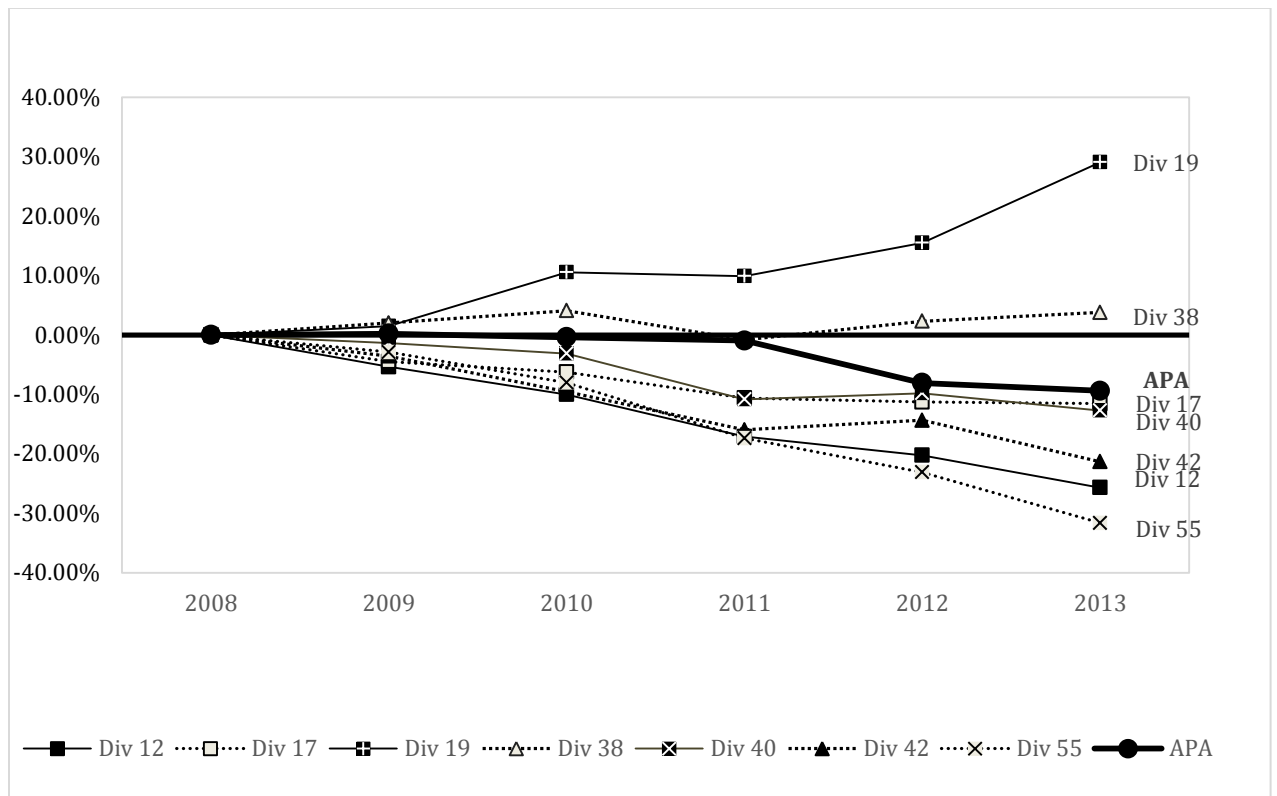

Mean Age of Division Members by Change in Division Size, 2008-2013.



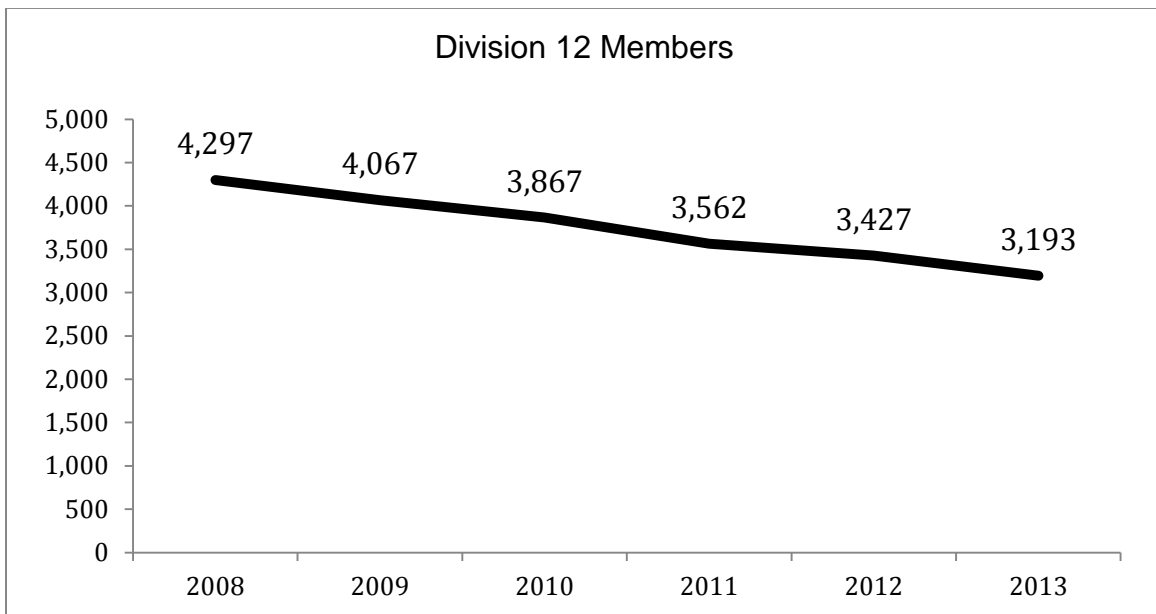
