

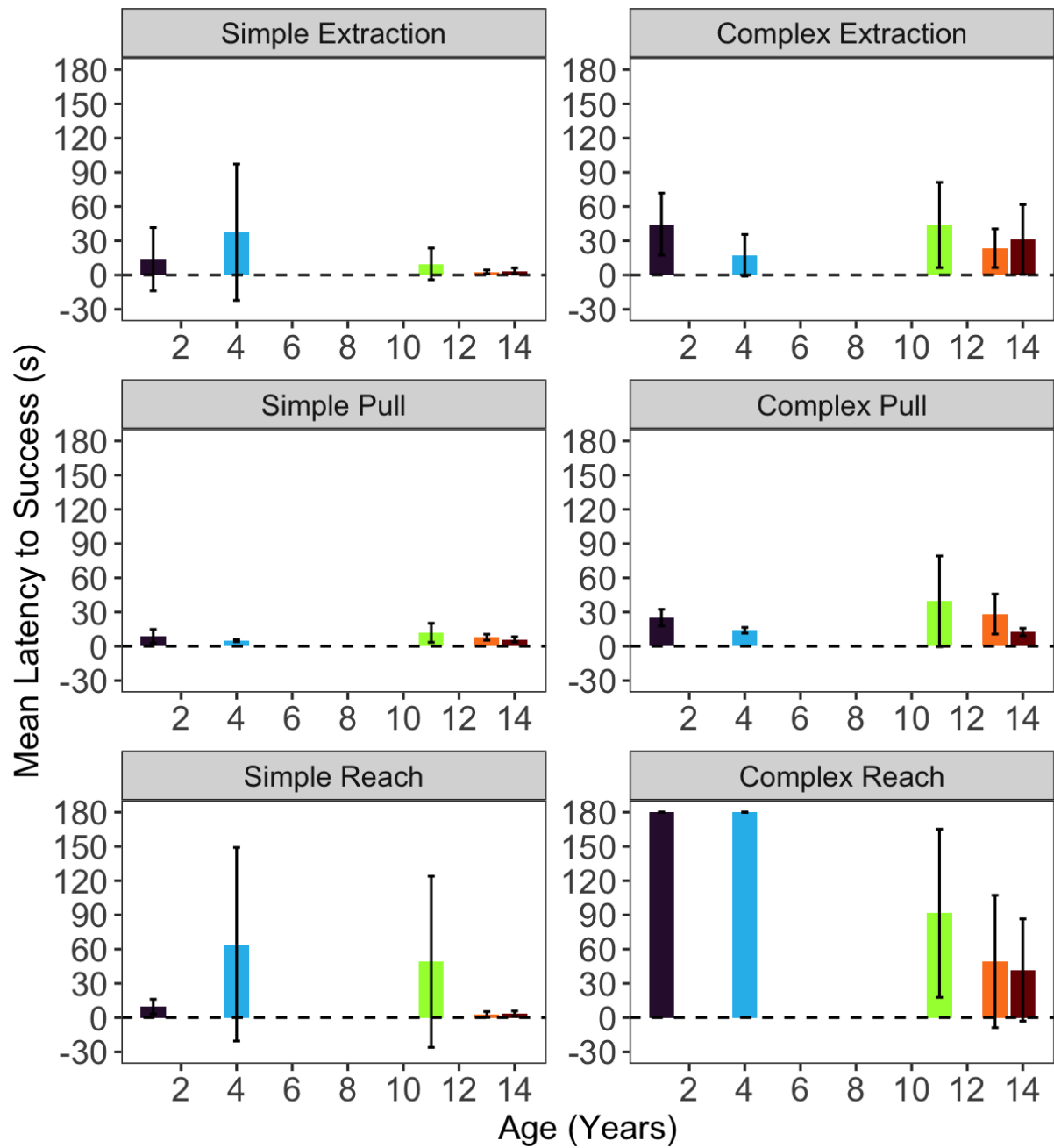

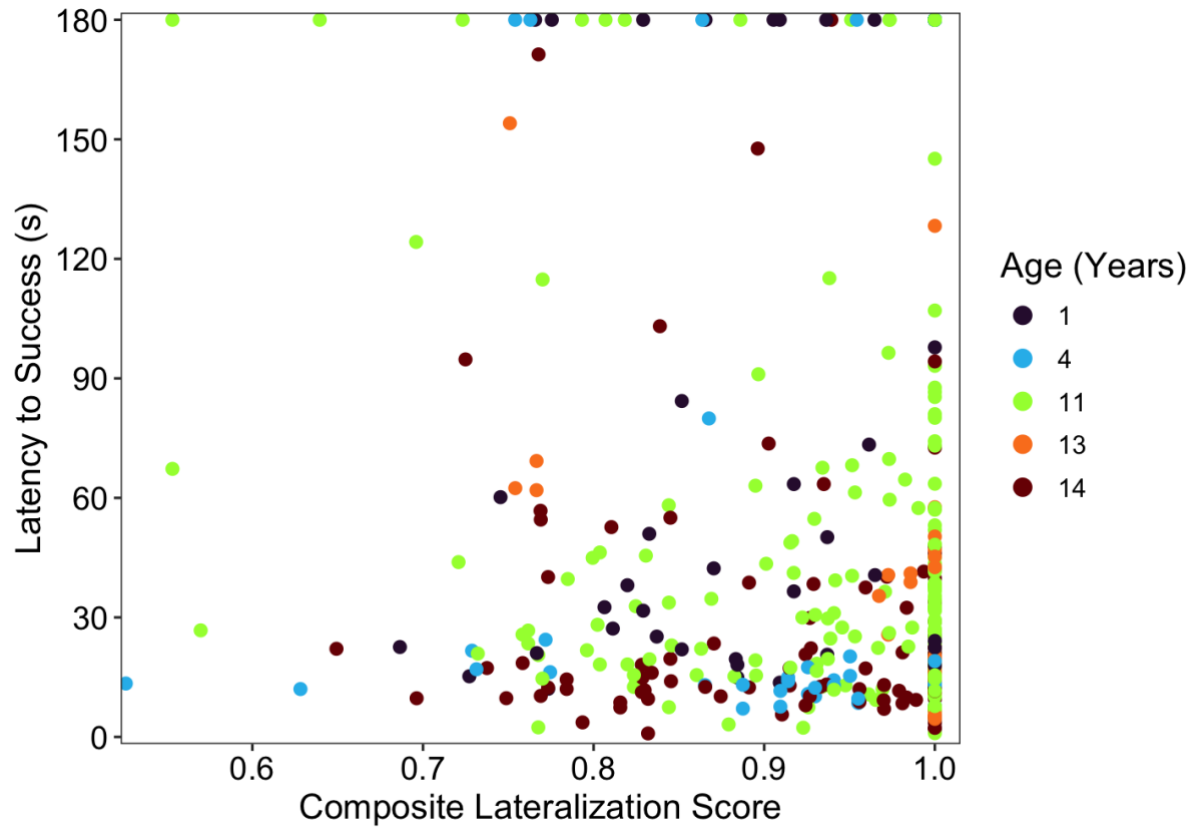
Task Latency to Success by Age

Percentage the Food-Dominant Foot Used in All Tasks by Age

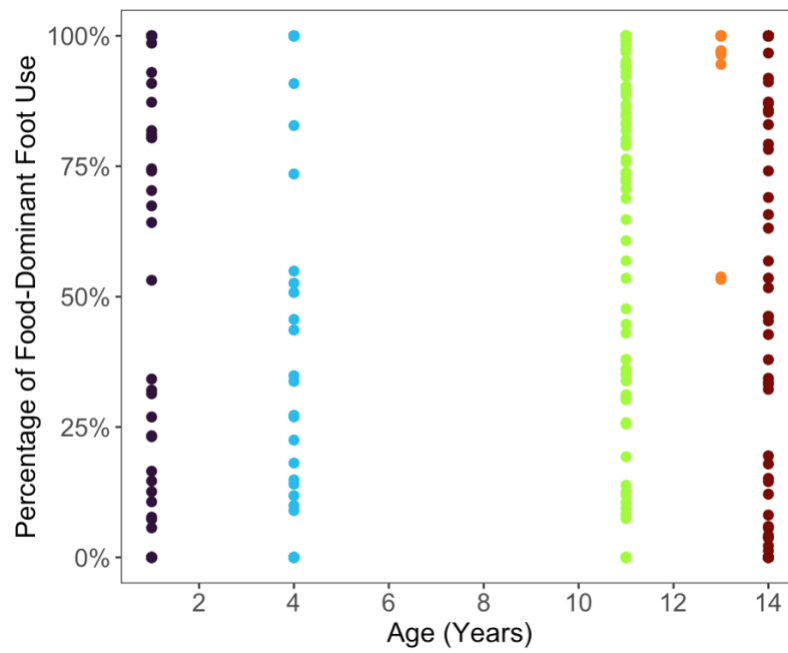

Foot Switching Number and Frequency in All Tasks by Age

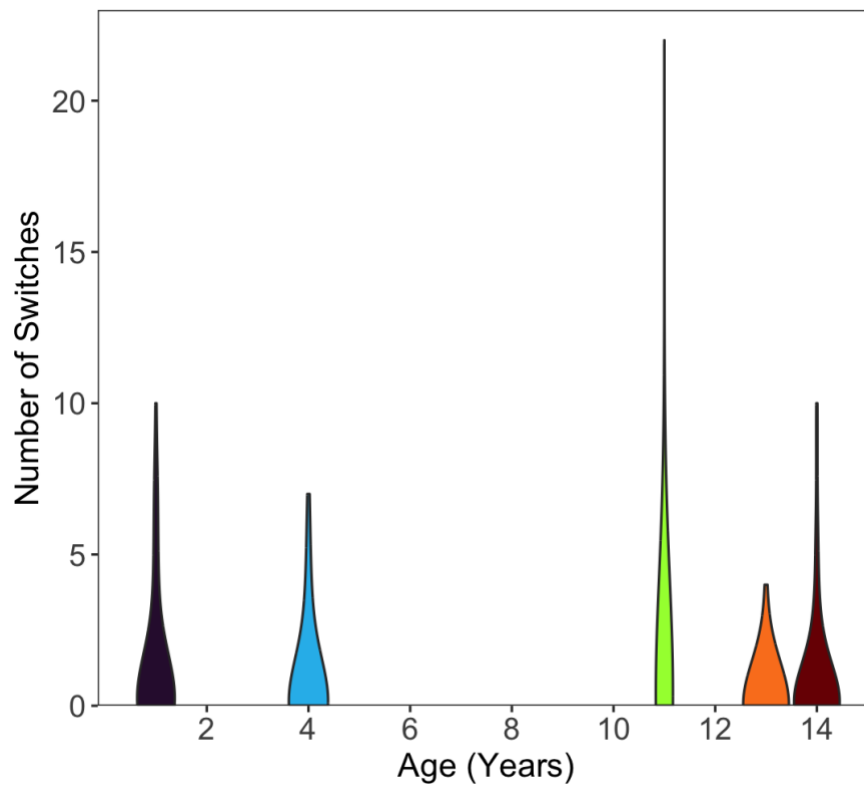
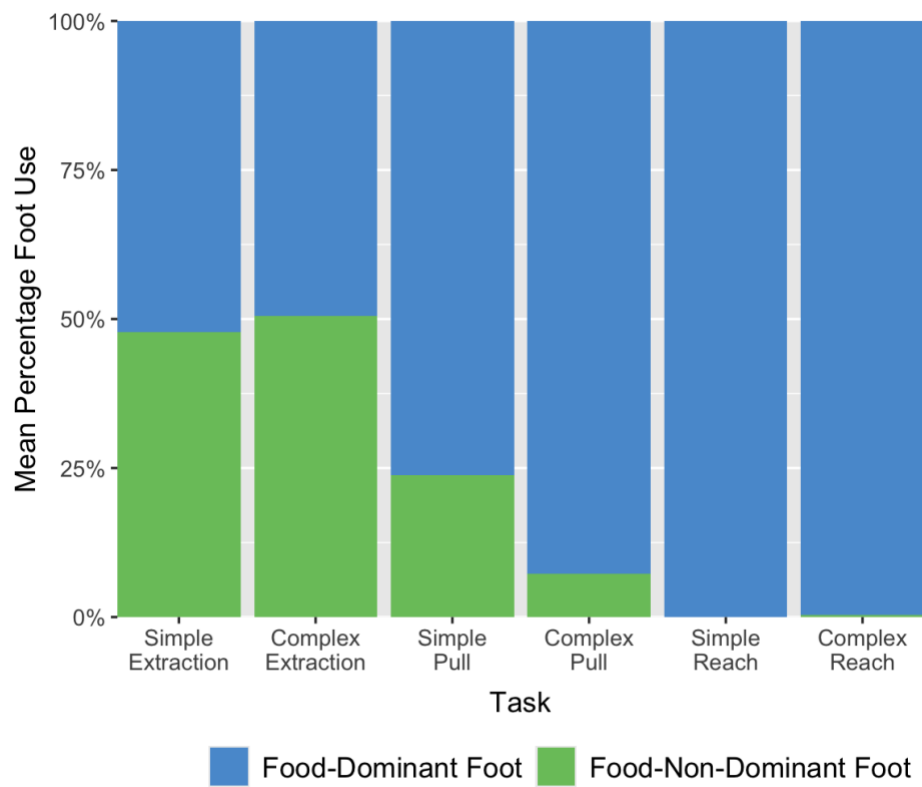
