

## Supplemental Material. Detailed Information on Parcels

The decision to utilize 3 parcels for latent constructs is informed by Little's (2013) methodological work on this topic. For externalizing symptomology, we rely on just 2 parcels because prior research and theory identifies the two sub-scales as well-established sub-scales of externalizing (the 3 internalizing subscales also were chosen for the same reason). Relying on a larger number necessitates larger sample sizes because it requires estimation of additional parameters.

They also have the effect of reducing the sample size needed to have adequate power because latent constructs are modeled with fewer observed indicators. Parceling for multi-item scales other than externalizing and internalizing symptomology was conducted using a balanced approach, whereby, a parcel was comprised of items with low and high factor loadings. Facet representative parceling was used for the established YSR internalizing and externalizing scales due to prior theory and research that has identified subscales for symptomology. Thus, parcels were created to represent the mean of subscale items (e.g., aggressive behavior and rule-breaking subscales for externalizing; anxious/depressed, withdrawn/depressed, and somatic complaints subscales for internalizing).

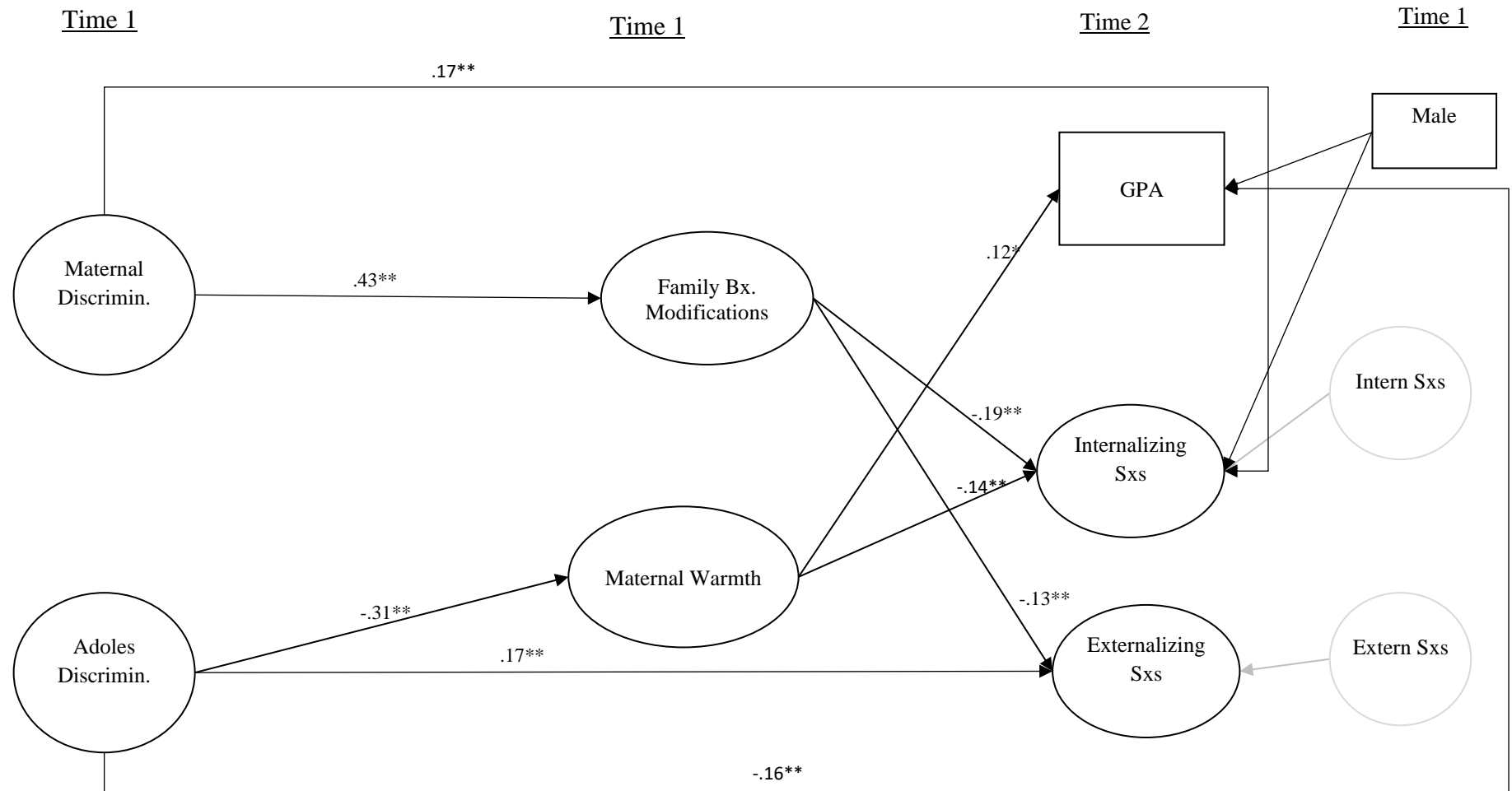

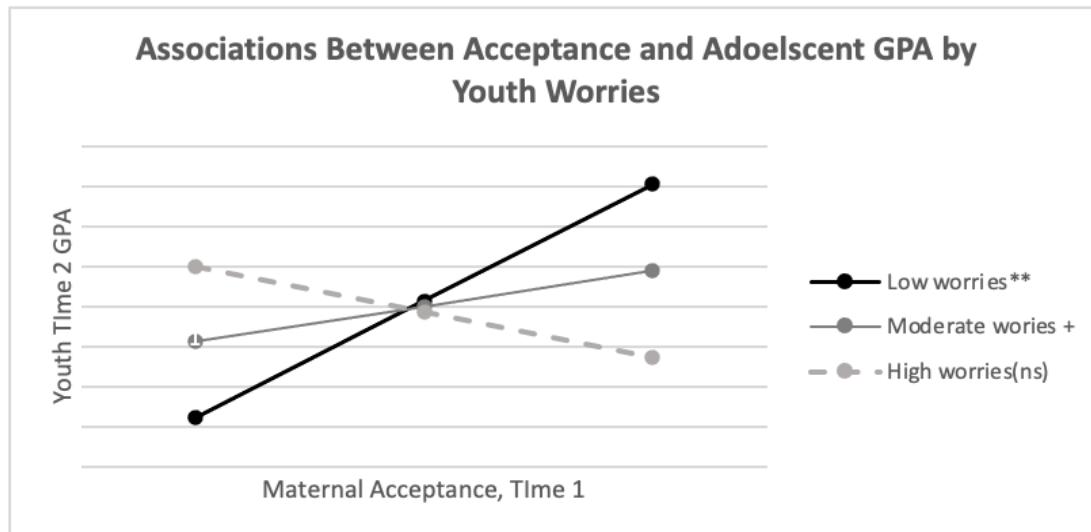

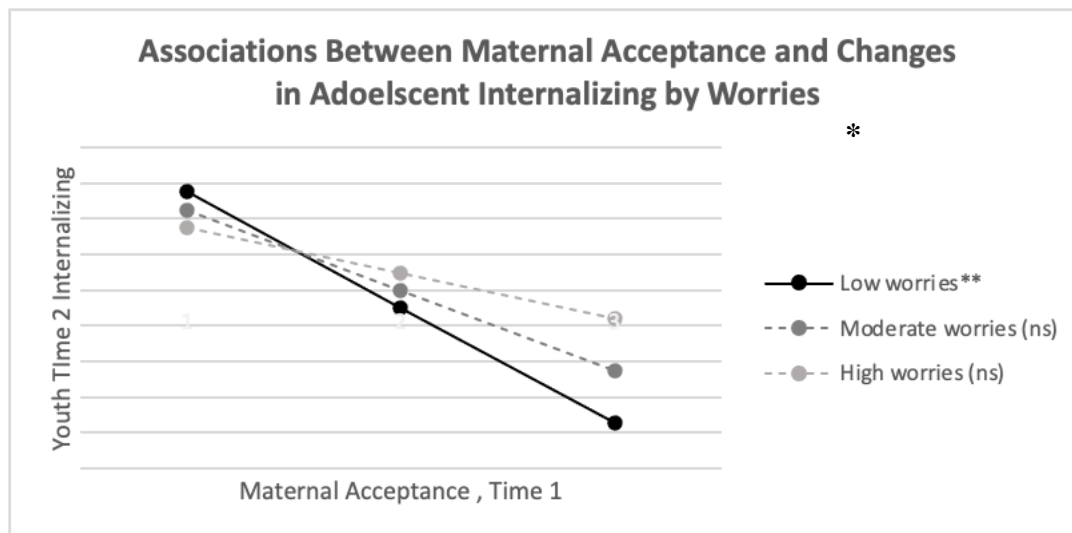


**Figure 1.** Final structural model of adolescent and maternal discrimination, maternal warmth family modifications, and adolescent academic and mental health outcomes. Standardized coefficients are presented.  $\chi^2(264) = 721.18, p < .00$ , SRMR = .06, CFI = .95, RMSEA = .06. Two-tailed significance tests presented at \*\*\*  $p < .001$ ; \*\*  $p < .01$ ; \*  $p < .05$ ; †  $p < .10$ .
